LexElectrify is a campaign to empower our community to make a plan to electrify our homes, businesses, and modes of transportation—and make them more efficient.

On February 6, join Maggie Peard, Lexington Sustainability and Resilience Officer and Andy Joynt, LexCAN's Clean Heat Outreach Specialist, as they walk us through the Make A Plan Checklist.
