**Mushroom Shares** in partnership with <u>Fat Moon Farm</u> and Egg Shares with a dozen large eggs weekly from <u>Chip-In Farm</u>'s free-running, cage-free hens are available year-round beginning late January.

A **Winter Vegetable Share** with organic produce grown by **Red Fire Farm** begins in February.


